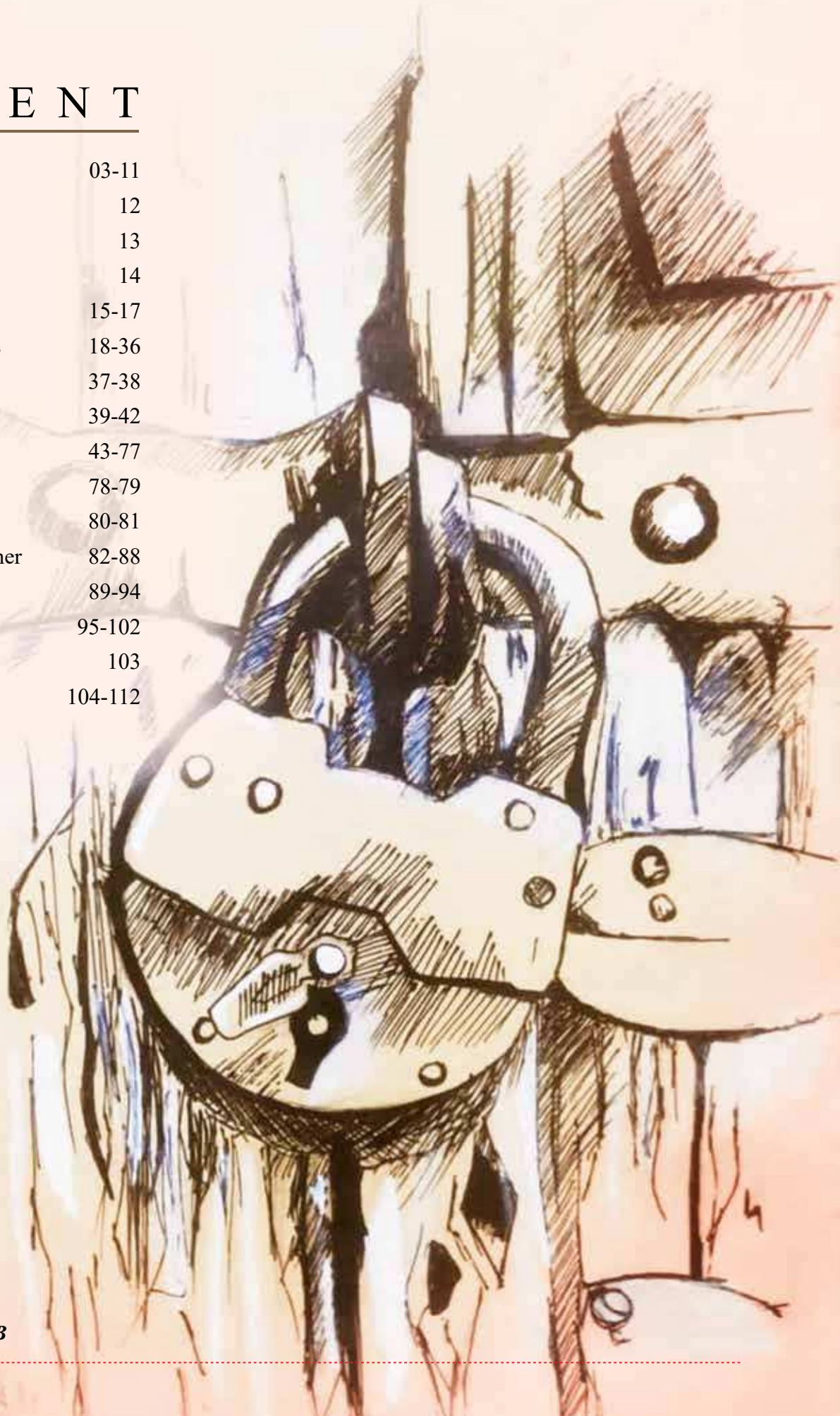



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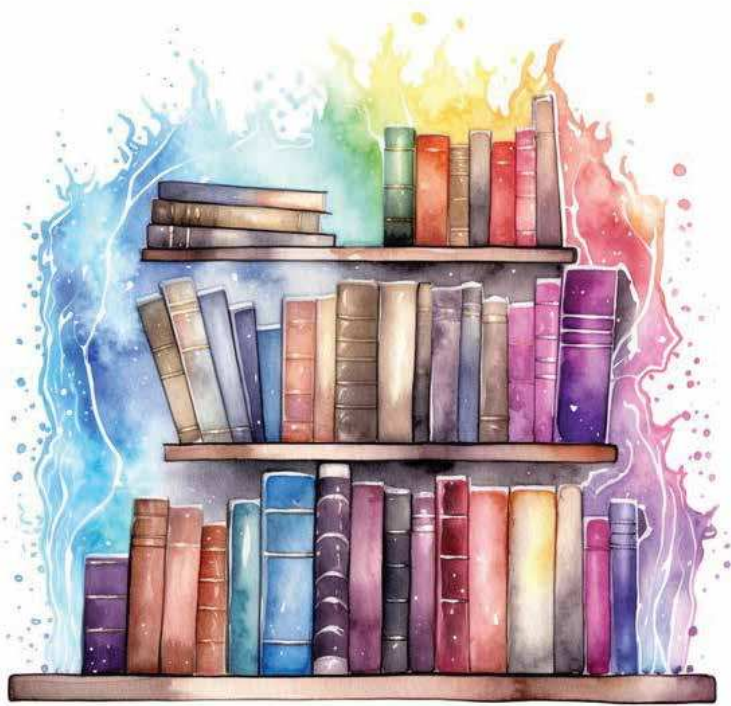

To get the death mystery revealed

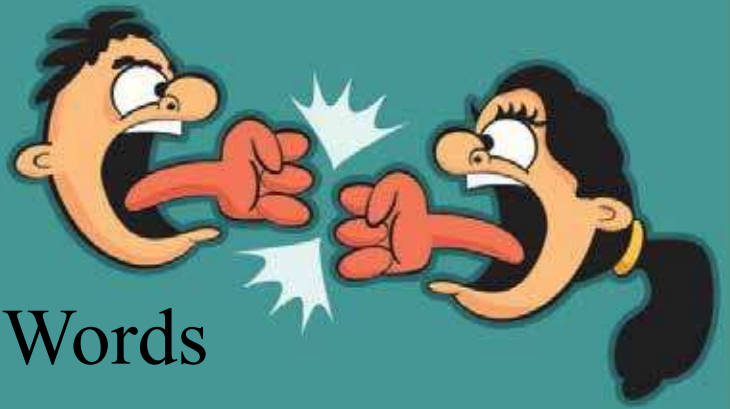
He walked to cemetery that night

Friendship Never Ends

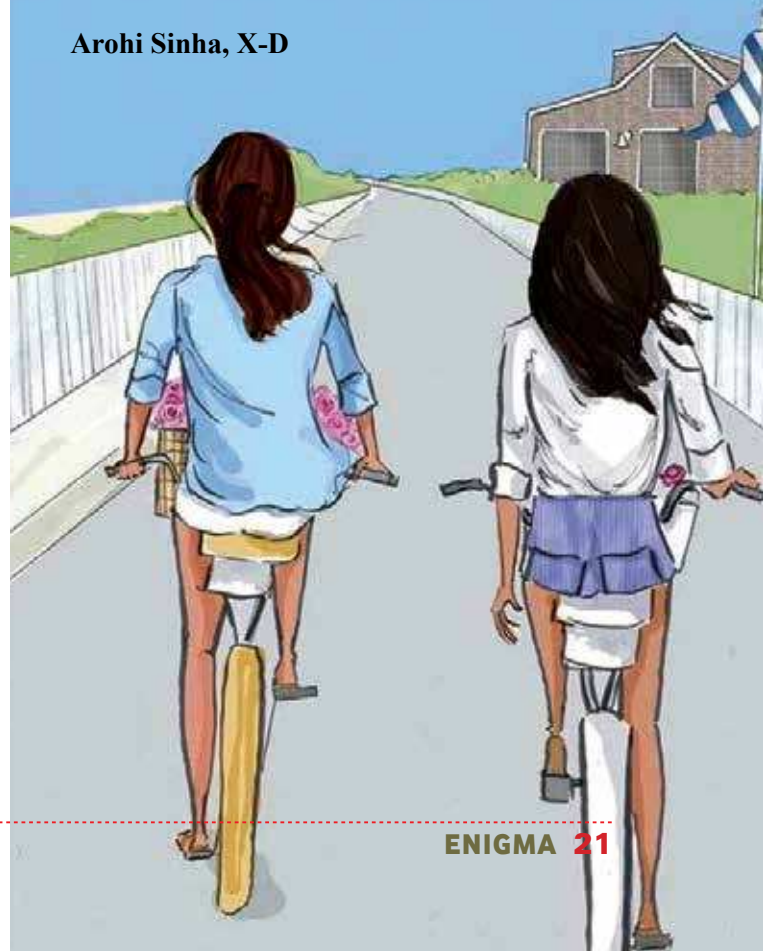
Feeling lonely in this world of bliss

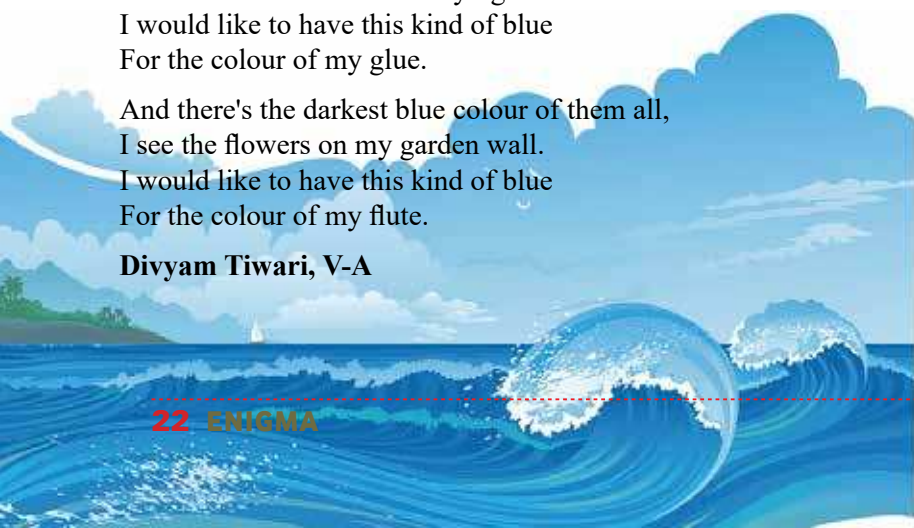

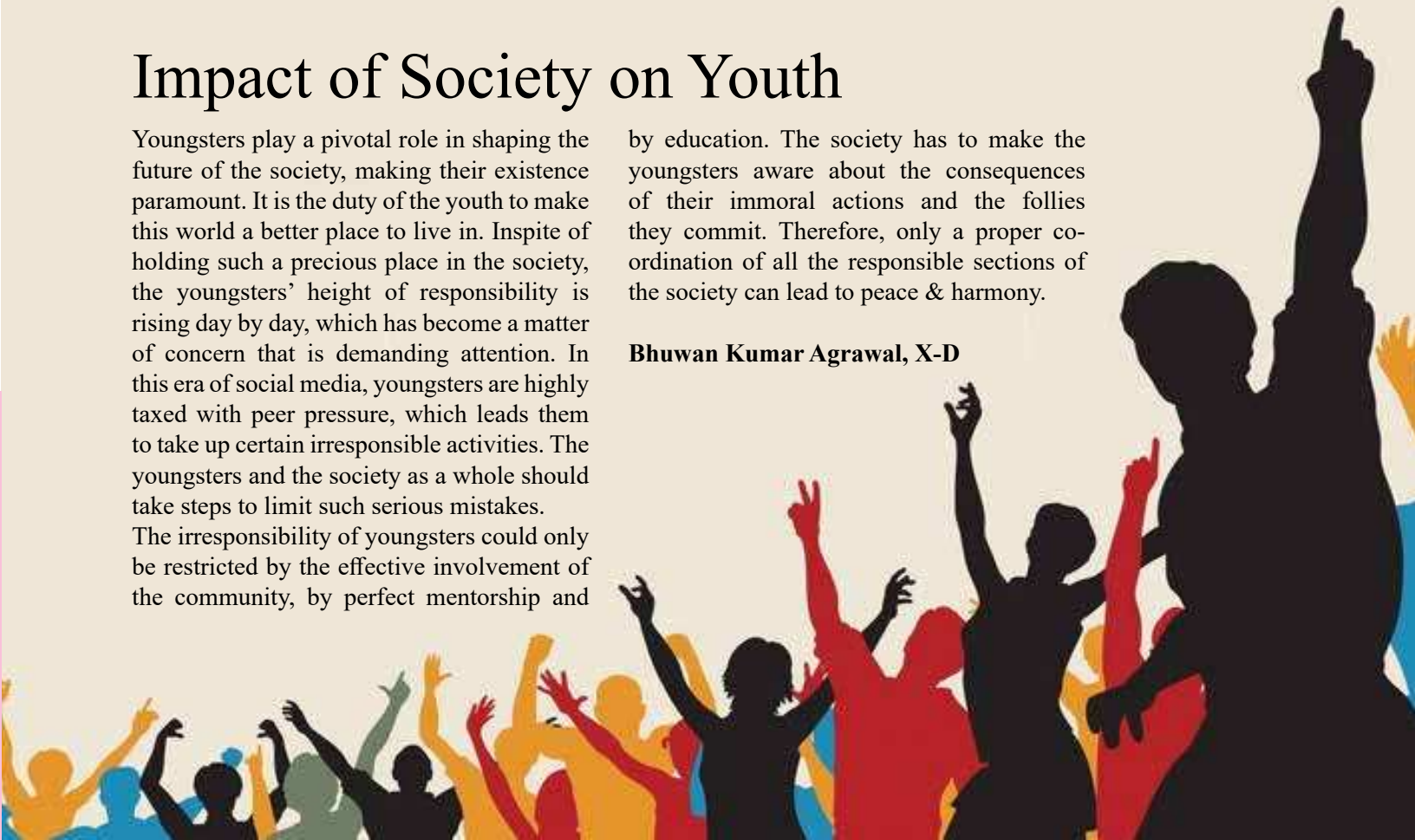
Impact of Society on Youth

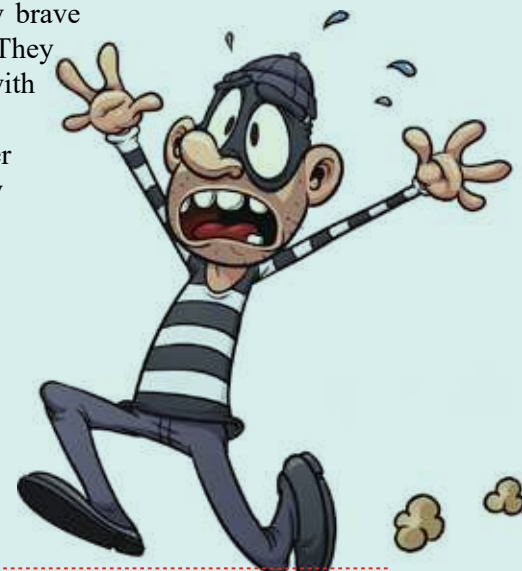


Home Alone

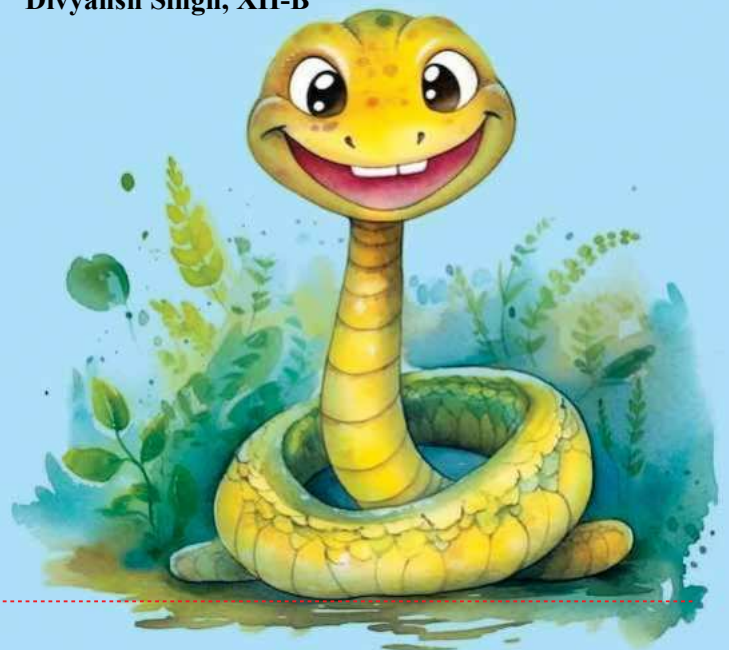

Phobias of Our Lives

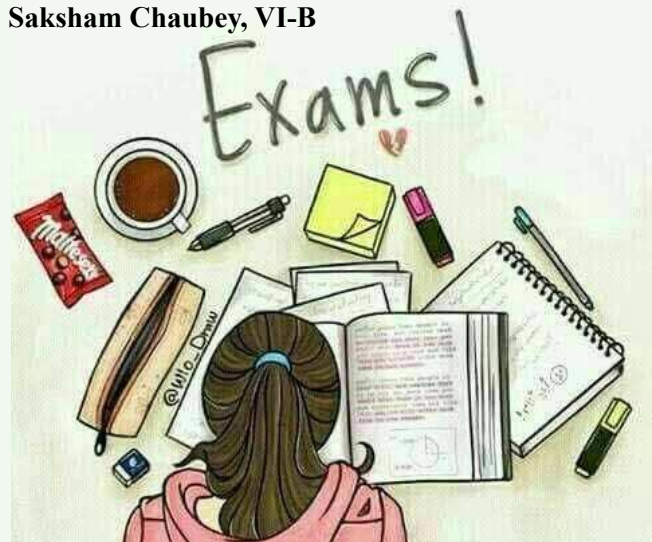
